Chess Champion MK II, [Novag's](#) second [dedicated chess computer](#) released in 1979. It had a [6502](#) compatible 6504 8-Bit processor running with 1 MHz, 5 KiB [ROM](#), and 320 bytes [RAM](#). The program was based on [Peter Jennings' Microchess 1.5](#).
