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### Chess-64, (Chess64)

a private chess engine by [Fabien Letouzey](#), supported and introduced by [Ryan Benitez](#)<sup>[1]</sup>. Chess-64 is a [bitboard](#) engine, not related to the bitboard port of [Fruit](#) by Ryan Benitez<sup>[2]</sup>. In Chess-64, Fabien did the bitboards, in Fruit, Ryan. They have little in common in they way they are used in the two programs<sup>[3]</sup>, for instance Chess-64 already used the [Blockers and Beyond](#) method to determine [sliding piece attacks](#) as well as none sliding piece attacks, eventually published in March 2014 in Fabien's new open source engine [Senpai](#)<sup>[4]</sup>. Chess-64 was already registered at [CCT10](#)<sup>[5]</sup>, but withdrew<sup>[6]</sup>. A public release of Chess-64 was neither officially announced nor realized.
