Fafner played the [First PCW Microcomputer Chess Championship](#) 1978 ^[1], and Fafner 2, written in [Pascal](#) and Assembly, supported by [Alex Kidson](#) ^[2], the [Third PCW Microcomputer Chess Championship](#) aka the First World Microcomputer Chess Championship 1980 in [London](#).
