Mephisto RISC,

a [dedicated chess computer module](#) for [Mephisto Module Systems](#) by [Hegener & Glaser](#), first launched in 1991. Produced by [TASC](#), and similar to the [ChessMachine](#), it used an [ARM2 RISC](#) processor to run the [Gideon](#) based program of [Ed Schröder's Rebel](#) family, which won the [WMCCC 1991](#) in [Vancouver](#). The RISC 2 Modul launched in 1994, was updated with Gideon 3.1 of the ChessMachine, which won the [WCCC 1992](#) in [Madrid](#).
