SpiderChess,

a chess engine by [Martin Giepmans](#) written in [Delphi](#), initially with an own [GUI](#) ^[1] and later [Chess Engine Communication Protocol](#) compatible to run under [WinBoard](#). SpiderChess played the [WMCCC 2001](#) (as SpiderGirl) and the [WCCC 2002](#), and various [Dutch Open Computer Chess Championships](#), [International CSVN Tournaments](#), and the [CCT6](#). When the code has become rather messy, Martin started his second approach from scratch ^[2], dubbed [Anatoli](#) ^[3].
